Dr Murray Kelly MD 1950-53

Murray Kelly spent a career keeping people alive while surgeons tried to kill them, as an anaesthetist, and at 82 years of age he shows plenty of signs of life himself.

Kelly "gave away the gassing" in 2012, but has remained a registered GP explaining "being registered saves an awful lot of time in being able to write scripts and referral notes to specialists."

Kelly left Silverstream in 1953 and studied medicine in Dunedin, graduating at the end of 1961.

He immediately migrated to Australia and after an internship trained in anaesthesia becoming a certified anaesthetist in 1968.

After a three year stint in London, Amsterdam and Copenhagen, Kelly volunteered for Vietnam war duty since he was treating the diggers on their return as a part of the 1st Military Hospital.

Kelly arrived in Vietnam in 1971 with the RAAMC (Vung Tau) and was so highly regarded in his tenure of work he remained a reserve officer until 1991.

"I traveled on my NZ passport (to Vietnam) as in those days the Australian Army were not at all perturbed where you came from," Kelly reflects.

"There was even a French doctor in the team. I often wonder if I was the only NZ doctor to go. The Kiwis had the usual gunnery function, but I doubt a medico was posted."

Kelly later settled in Brisbane with his family, becoming the Director of Medical Services' (Northern Command) anaesthetic consultant. Additionally he rose to the rank of Lt. Col in the military.

Music was an interest and Kelly played the 1st violin in the school orchestra with Fr Ward and later Brother Alexander conducting.

While at Silverstream, Kelly developed a life long passion for photography, inspired by Father Alex McDonald.

Kelly got his first 35mm camera in his last term at school and now has over 50 cameras and km of film.

Kelly's two other passions are cars and ham radio. If you Google vk4aok (his an old ham radio code) you can see some of Kelly's images.

While at college, Kelly was member of Res Militaris (Military training corp)

"Yes I remember it well. I went into the Sigs and we had a week up at the King's Belt on the range at Trentham. We were the contact between the mound and the butts. Some of the lads ended up with bad sunburn! So that piqued my interest in radio and guns. The Sigs were the laziest and best marchers in sandpaper suits".

Make-A-Wish builds a basketball yard in Lower Hutt teen's backyard

Sometimes wishes come true - something 17-year-old Piripi (Pip) Korent knows well.

When Pip, a Year 13 student at St Patrick's College Silverstream, was diagnosed with cancer in Year 11, looking forward to playing basketball again was something that kept him going.

So when charity Make-A-Wish got in touch with him, he knew he wanted to do something with his favourite sport."At first, I just asked for a basketball hoop. But then [the Make-A-Wish volunteer] brought up the whole idea of a halfcourt.



"She took us outside to our backyard and she was saying, 'we could fit that in here'." Pip was all for it.

"Ever since I could remember, me and my brother have been talking about having a halfcourt in our backvard."

Basketball has been a big part of Pip's life ever since age 8, when he first started playing.

His training and games went on hold while he was going through treatment last year but once he'd finished chemo he was back playing.

"I finished chemo on a Friday then had a St Pat's traditional - an exchange more or less - a couple of day's after. I was a bit dead after that, not gonna lie. But it was good to be back out there."

His mum, Jo, said basketball was a huge driver for Pip and having the court put in made a difference for the family.

"When the wish started to happen, it was really exciting and a nice distraction. We started to look forward a bit more," she said.

Work on the court began a few months ago and it took about four months for all of the work to be finished off. Pip, his family, friends and members of the basketball community had a small unofficial opening party for the court in early June.

For the court, Airtime Hoops donated a professional-level hoop and backboard, while companies Mico, Firth and Placemakers donated labour, materials and helped with digging out the court and laying concrete.

Pip will be putting in many more hours training on the court as he prepares for a trip to Las Vegas in mid-July with the New Zealand Basketball Academy.







Appointed as a judge in 2004, Judge Hikaka has 20-year career in the legal profession, where he has practiced in the Family and Youth Court jurisdictions.


